Course Material: This course will cover chapters 1–5 of the text. The main topics are the limits of functions, differentiation of functions, and integration of functions. We will cover a number of applications of each.

- Each in class exam will be worth 15% of your total grade.
- The common final exam will be cumulative and is worth 25% of your total grade.
